## Healing Children

<b>Amara:</b> Parenting and adoption services to create safety and permanence for at-risk and special-needs foster children.	\$18,000
<b>Brigid Collins Family Support Center:</b> Therapy, case management and parenting education for at-risk families with children birth to 12 years old.	\$10,000
<b>Childhaven:</b> Developmentally-focused trauma care and treatment services to support the healing of abused and neglected children ages 0-5.	\$20,000
<b>Dawson Place Child Advocacy Center:</b> Coordinated medical, mental health, advocacy, protection and law-enforcement services for abused children in Snohomish County.	\$20,000
<b>Encompass:</b> Fully-equipped lab to facilitate therapy programs for children and families in rural areas, homeless shelters, transitional housing and schools.	\$30,000
<b>HopeSparks:</b> Specialized counseling for children who have been abused or traumatized, with family support and parent education.	\$18,000
<b>Intercultural Children and Family Services:</b> Culturally responsive home visitation and intervention services that are evidence-based and family-centered.	\$18,000
<b>Jumping Mouse:</b> Long-term expressive mental health therapy and social advocacy for abused and neglected children.	\$17,000
<b>Kindering:</b> Home visitation, counseling and referral services for foster caregivers to build secure caregiver/child attachments and parenting skills.	\$17,000
<b>Northwest Immigrant Rights Project:</b> Legal services and advocacy for abused, abandoned and undocumented immigrant children.	\$33,000
<b>Wellspring Family Services:</b> Trauma-informed early learning center and parenting support serving homeless families to help mitigate the traumatic impacts of homelessness.	\$20,000

## Strengthening Families

<b>Abused Deaf Women's Advocacy Services:</b> Housing, counseling, parenting and children's programs for Deaf and DeafBlind victims of sexual/domestic violence.	\$13,000
<b>Denise Louie Education Center:</b> High-quality multicultural early learning and family support services.	\$8,000
<b>Domestic Violence &amp; Sexual Assault Services:</b> Services to increase child safety and prevent future violence for families who have experienced domestic violence.	\$16,000
<b>Domestic Violence Services of Snohomish County:</b> Shelter, case management and integrated support for victims of domestic abuse and their children.	\$11,500
<b>Family Education &amp; Support Services:</b> Program to help related caregivers of abused children gain skills, support and resources to ensure the children in their care thrive.	\$19,500
<b>Housing Hope:</b> Therapeutic programming to help homeless and at-risk families overcome barriers to age-appropriate development for their children.	\$14,000

<b>LifeWire:</b> Support groups, advocacy assistance and one-on-one counseling for children and youth who have experienced violence or abuse in their homes.	\$13,000
<b>Parent Trust for Washington Children:</b> Support and education services for at-risk families through every stage of a child's life.	\$19,000
<b>Rochester Organization of Families:</b> Resources and services for children, youth and families to achieve a healthy, positive and drug-free community.	\$19,000
<b>SafePlace:</b> Basic needs and comprehensive, age-appropriate support services for children and teens in families who have experienced domestic violence.	\$18,000
<b>Skagit Domestic Violence &amp; Sexual Assault Services:</b> Shelter, case management and integrated support services for victims of domestic abuse and their children.	\$5,000

## Empowering Youth

<b>A Way Home Washington:</b> A statewide movement that builds awareness and increases community capacity to prevent and end youth and young adult homelessness.	\$25,000
<b>Boys &amp; Girls Clubs of King County:</b> Supportive and consistent services for youth experiencing foster care, kinship care and/or adoptee from foster care.	\$7,000
<b>Center for Children &amp; Youth Justice:</b> Develops and advances innovative approaches to systemic change to support kids, stabilize families and strengthen communities.	\$8,000
<b>FareStart:</b> Comprehensive job training for homeless and at-risk youth.	\$10,000
<b>Friends of Youth:</b> Housing, support services and case management for homeless young parents and their children.	\$15,000
<b>Mockingbird Society:</b> Foster care system development through youth leadership, legislative advocacy and extended family model for foster care.	\$12,500
<b>Olive Crest:</b> Serving youth ages 15-21 by providing safe and permanent housing, life-skills mentorship and wrap around services to heal from trauma.	\$12,000
<b>ROOTS:</b> Emergency shelter, case management and access to a continuum of support services for homeless young adults in Seattle's University District.	\$10,000
<b>SafeFutures Youth Center:</b> Comprehensive services to help low-income and refugee/immigrant youth build healthy futures and break down barriers that hinder success.	\$17,500
<b>Shared Housing Services:</b> Connecting youth ages 16-24 with homeowners who provide safe, stable home and mentorship while the youth works with case management.	\$5,000
<b>Teen Feed:</b> Low-barrier/trauma-focused crisis intervention, service referrals and life-skills mentorship for homeless, high-risk youth.	\$12,500
<b>YouthCare:</b> Housing and support services for homeless minors ages 14-17.	\$34,000
