We provide grants that **prevent child abuse and neglect for families at the greatest risk**, and that support healing and stability for families impacted by domestic violence and homelessness. We prioritize programs that use integrated services to help build family protective factors.

Healing Children

Amara: Parenting and adoption services to create safety and permanence for at-risk and special-needs foster children. **\$18,000**

Boyer Children's Clinic: In-home therapeutic intervention to support foster parents in building nurturing relationships with young children who have special healthcare needs. **\$15,000**

Brigid Collins Family Support Center: Therapy, case management and parenting education for at-risk families with children birth to 12 years old. **\$10,000**

Childhaven: Developmentally-focused trauma care and treatment services to support the healing of abused and neglected children ages 0-5. **\$20,000**

Dawson Place Child Advocacy Center: Coordinated medical, mental health, advocacy, protection and law-enforcement services for abused children in Snohomish County. **\$20,000**

Encompass: Fully-equipped lab to facilitate therapy programs for children and families in rural areas, homeless shelters, transitional housing and schools. **\$30,000**

HopeSparks: Specialized counseling for children who have been abused or traumatized, with family support and parent education. **\$18,000**

Intercultural Children and Family Services: Culturally responsive home visitation and intervention services that are evidence-based and family-centered. **\$18,000**

Jumping Mouse: Long-term expressive mental health therapy and social advocacy for abused and neglected children. **\$17,000**

Kindering: Home visitation, counseling and referral services for foster caregivers to build secure caregiver/child attachments and parenting skills. **\$17,000**

King County Sexual Assault Resource Center: Therapeutic interventions to support healing in child and youth victims of sexual abuse and their families. **\$33,000**



Lutheran Community Services Northwest: Provides safe, secure and permanent homes for children who have experienced abuse and neglect. **\$17,000**

Northwest Immigrant Rights Project: Legal services and advocacy for abused, abandoned and undocumented immigrant children. **\$33,000**

Pediatric Interim Care Center: Immediate, short-term, medically supervised care for drug-exposed and fragile infants. **\$15,000**

Ryther: Implementation of a trauma-informed framework for intervention with youth and families who have experienced multiple and/or prolonged traumatic stress. **\$30,000**

Toddler Learning Center: Education services and therapy in the home for young children and families with intensive medical, mental or social risk factors. **\$18,000**

Wellspring Family Services: Trauma-informed early learning center and parenting support serving homeless families to help mitigate the traumatic impacts of homelessness. **\$20,000**

Total Awarded: \$1,008,000



FOCUS AREA: Healing Children

These grants help child victims of abuse and neglect **heal from their traumatic experiences and find permanency and stability.** We prioritize programs that target long-term benefits that build resiliency, and prevent survivors from growing up to become abusers themselves.
