King County Sexual Assault Resource Center: Array of therapeutic interventions to support healing in child and youth victims of sexual abuse and their families.	100,000^E
Pediatric Interim Care Center: Immediate, short-term, medically supervised care for drug-exposed and fragile infants.	30,000^S
Ryther: Residential and outpatient behavioral and mental health services for traumatized children and families who are struggling to succeed together.	15,200
Secret Harbor: Therapeutic foster care, in-home support and residential treatment services for young people who have experienced significant trauma due to abuse and neglect.	30,000^S
Toddler Learning Center: Education services and therapy in the home for young children and families with intensive medical, mental or social risk factors.	30,000^S
Youth Advocacy Center of Lewis County: A multidisciplinary, child-focused approach to reducing the trauma of physical and sexual abuse on child victims.	6,000
YWCA Pierce County: Therapeutic and support services to mitigate the negative effects of domestic violence for children and teens.	6,000

Center for Human Services: Support services and parenting education to help related caregivers of at-risk children gain skills and resources.	13,700
ChildStrive: Therapeutic in-home parenting support and education for families living with trauma or chronic hardship.	12,000
Domestic Abuse Women's Network: Comprehensive, empowerment-based programs and services to help survivors and their children attain and maintain violence-free lives.	14,000
Domestic Violence Services of Snohomish County: Community education plus shelter, case management and integrated support for victims of domestic abuse and their children in Snohomish County.	100,000^E
InterFaith Association of NW Washington: Referral, support and advocacy services for families during and after their stay in emergency shelter.	30,000^S
Lydia Place: Parent educator home visits, group parenting education and therapeutic interventions for children in shelters and transitional housing.	30,000^S
Mary's Place: Emergency shelter and support services for homeless families to minimize trauma and assist them in moving quickly to safe, longer-term housing.	12,000

New Phoebe House Association: Comprehensive recovery and reunification program for families who face multiple challenges and are involved with the child welfare system.	10,000

Cocoon House: Quality, safe and stable housing and wraparound support services for homeless youth and teen mothers for up to 18 months.	30,000^S
Communities In Schools of Lakewood: Mentoring, tutoring and emergency services for underprivileged children provided through a network of community volunteers.	30,000^S
Communities In Schools of Renton: Mentoring, tutoring and wraparound support services for at-risk students.	30,000^S
Kids in Need of Defense: Legal services and advocacy for abused, abandoned, and undocumented immigrant children.	10,000
Legal Counsel For Youth and Children: Multidisciplinary, holistic legal advocacy for children in child welfare, homeless youth and immigrant families.	13,300
Northwest Youth Services: Emergency housing and case management for homeless youth ages 13-17.	30,000^S
Ryan's House For Youth: Quality, safe and stable housing, including emergency shelter, transitional housing and drop-in center, with wraparound services for homeless youth 12-24.	16,300
TeamChild: Advocacy and specialized legal services connecting high-needs youth in crisis with support programs and services.	13,300
Treehouse: Comprehensive support for the educational needs of youth in foster care.	100,000^E
YWCA Clark County: Supports foster youth in their transition into adulthood and independence by connecting them with resources such as affordable housing, job training, financial education and healthcare.	13,300
